selected open studio artist bio's

pat macgillis has exhibited her art locally and nationally for over twenty years. Her recent paintings were included in the 2007 Juried Biannual Cannon Gallery, Carlsbad City Library. She has had many solo exhibits. She was selected to participate in the California Arts Council San Diego CORO arts leadership program and has been the recipient of grants for community art projects. She teaches at the UCSD Craft Center and has taught adults and children in the community. MacGillis has maintained a studio at BorrelliSpace for three years and will have a solo exhibit of her mixed media contemporary abstract paintings in October 2007.

gerardo was born in Mexico City, and it is there that he began painting at the age of eleven, and by thirteen he was a serious student of several media. He majored in Graphic Arts at the University of Mexico and studied with many gifted teachers who influenced his current style. His first exhibit in Mexico City in 1984 met with great acclaim. His artwork is currently on exhibit in galleries in Los Angeles and San Diego and throughout southern California. In February 2005, he presented his first New York showing at Jadite Galleries in midtown Manhattan. He has been busy since moving to University Heights in 2003 with new works and commissions, and has been exploring craftworks such as paper mache tolework and masks. Gerardo's studio is located at 1525 Monroe Avenue.

jeffrey wyne is a mixed media artist and photographer who devotes much of his time to themed collage work and Polaroid image transfer photography. His work has been exhibited in public and private venues throughout the West, and is included in private collections in Pacific coast cities from Gig Harbor to the Mexican border. Jeffrey also has an ongoing interest in book arts and pen and ink sketching.

Jeffrey, a native San Diegan, studied art under the guidance of Norma Soule and Richard M. Greene. He has an undergraduate degree from the University of California at Santa Barbara; he has a master's degree from San Diego State University. Visit Jeffrey's studio at 2121 1/2 Mission Avenue.

alexis archibald graduated from Edinboro University of Pennsylvania where she received a Bachelors of Fine Art with an emphasis on education and metalsmithing. Alexis showed her work in Pittsburgh and surrounding northeast region, taught art in the city high school system, and lead metalsmithing workshops. Alexis studied with nationally acclaimed metal smith Jan Loney at her Metalier Studios in Pittsburgh, PA. There Alexis learned many of Jan's tricks and techniques. She recently relocated to San Diego. Currently, she continues to create art through painting and metal work in her studio, and exhibits her work at local galleries and exhibitions. As the UHAA Art Education Director, she brings art to our local schools, and inspires and teaches both children and adults. Alexis also completed an ostrich egg for Eggstravaganza which will be available for auction at Swedenborg Hall on September 16th. Alexis will be displaying at the event hub, Birney Academy with 30 other visual artists.

Joseph Bennett first saw images of Joseph Cornell's work nearly eight years ago, he recalls catching his breath and thinking that's for him. The experience changed his life. Since then, he has had the honor of exhibiting his assemblages in more than forty-five galleries and museums. His work is currently held in private collections in the US, Mexico and Europe. Recently, twenty-one of his works were exhibited at the Peabody Essex Museum in Salem, MA, alongside of Cornell's retrospective (curated by the Smithsonian Institute). Joseph will have his studio open at 4193 Alabama Street. Joseph completed an ostrich egg for Eggstravaganza.

jo caldwell received a BA in 1988 from UCSD with a contemporary emphasis on theory. Following that she went on to produce a large body of work and an MFA at Cal State Fullerton - where she also taught a class in Beginning Painting in 1993. Essentially her work is about people, their appearance, their confusions, and their inability to be at peace. Man and his ability to reason and make choices is the standard and root of all art whether figurative or abstract. Her oil technique is founded on the application of paint in many thin layers using a wax based medium. Jo's body of work includes monoprints, photography, portraits and graphic media. Jo's studio is located at 4576 North Avenue, #3.

With a love of gardening, **Jennifer meeder** brings her garden indoors to her studio. Each fresh and vibrant flower "portrait" is a study in color and shape. Her realistic watercolors capture the character of each petal, leaf, and hue. Jennifer has received numerous awards, and is a juried member of Southwestern Artists' Association, Gallery 23 in Spanish Village Art Center at Balboa Park. Currently, Jennifer is teaching watercolor classes at the Dragonfly Center in La Mesa and is represented by Gallery 23 in Spanish Village and the Dragonfly Center. Jennifer will be displaying at the Elaine Davis studio complex at 4576 Maryland Street with Elaine Davis, Betty Martinez and Maryellene Deason. Live music and trolley stop located in front.
